

Parent Code of Conduct:



1. Be Supportive, Not Distracting:

- Be positive and encourage all players, not just your child.
- **AT NO POINT** is it acceptable to be shouting instructions from the stands—
 - i. **If this occurs**, you, the parent, will be asked to step out/leave.
 - ii. **If it happens a 2nd time**, your player will not be invited to come back for the remaining sessions.
- Let the coaches do the coaching.

2. Respect the Coaches and Staff:

- Trust the coaching process and refrain from questioning drills or methods during sessions.
- Direct any questions or concerns to the coaches at the appropriate time (not during practice).

3. Promote a Positive Atmosphere:

- Use encouraging language and set an example.
- Avoid negative comments about other players, parents, or coaches, and/or drills.

4. Focus on Development Over Results:

- Remember, the clinic's goal is skill and knowledge improvement, not competition.
- Celebrate progress and effort, regardless of outcomes or mistakes.

5. Observe from Designated Areas:

- Watch from the designated spectating areas.
- The bench IS OFF LIMITS. This is not a space for spectating.
- Respect facility rules and ensure you're not disrupting the session.

6. Help Foster Independence:

- Encourage your child to be responsible for their own preparation, including equipment and hydration.
- Allow them to engage directly with the coaches without interference and encourage them to ask questions and be curious!

7. Be Punctual:

- Ensure your child arrives and is picked up on time.
- Allow enough time for them to prepare before the session.

8. Support a Growth Mindset:

- Reinforce the importance of effort, learning, and resilience over immediate success.
- Avoid placing undue pressure on your child to perform perfectly.

9. Maintain Open Communication:

- If you have concerns or feedback, schedule a time to discuss them with the coaches privately.
- Avoid addressing issues publicly or during a session.

10. Be a Role Model:

- Show respect to all players, parents, coaches, and facility staff.
- Uphold the values of work ethic, curiosity, and respect that we're teaching the players.
